Every effort will be made to offer you an appointment on the same day, Urgent cases and patients without an appointment will always be seen but you may have to wait. If you are unable to keep an appointment let us know so we can offer it to another patient.

Home Visits

If you are unable to visit the Surgery please telephone before 10.00 am with full details. Please do not ask for a doctor to visit unless really necessary. If you can come to the Surgery you will be seen early. This may be quicker than a visit.

Prescriptions

If you take any medicines regularly you will be issued with a computerised list. Repeat Prescriptions can be requested in person or by Post (if a self-addressed envelope is included). We regret it is not possible to accept requests by telephone. Please collect after 11 am and allow two working days for processing.

Test Results and Telephone Calls

If you want to speak to the Doctor or the Nurse the best time to telephone is between 1200 - 1300 hours. Tell the receptionist if you are Telephoning about a Test Result.

Receptionists

The reception desk is open from 08:00 to 13:00 hours and from 15:00 to 18:00 hours on weekdays. The receptionists will be happy to help you by answering your queries, explaining the organisation of the practice, taking

messages for the doctor as well as arranging appointments and dealing with requests for repeat prescriptions.

Practice Nurse: Mon & Thurs (Full day)

If you wish to see the nurse please make an appointment at the reception desk, or by Telephone.

District Nurses

District nurses are attached to the practice. At the doctor's request they provide nursing treatment and advice to the housebound and patients recently discharged from hospital.

Health Visitors

Health visitors visit all families with children under five years. They also provide information, advice and support to all age groups, particularly at times of physical or emotional stress.

Community Midwife

A Community midwife is attached to the Practice and together with the doctor she provides antenatal care. Following delivery she provides care for the mother and baby for the first two weeks.

Additional Clinics Health Checks

On registration all patients will be given an appointment for a general health check. Every person over 75 years is advised to have an annual health check.

Health Promotion

The practice places special emphasis on the promotion of good health. The following clinics are organised by the practice nurse under your doctor's supervision:

The practice nurse also gives advice on ways of reducing smoking and alcohol intake, as well as diet, exercise and stress management.

Cervical Smears

It is the policy of the practice to recommend that all women have a cervical smear at least every three to five years. If you have not had a smear within this period, please make an appointment with the practice nurse. Smear results are posted to you in approximately one month. Please bring SAE to the appointment.

Immunisation for Foreign Travel

You will need to seek advice from your travel agent or look in 'Yellow Pages' for the nearest Travel Clinic. Please make an appointment with the practice nurse.

Family Planning & Family Welfare Service

Family planning is undertaken by the doctor and the practice nurse.

X-Rays

When requested by the doctor, X-rays should be arranged by appointment at Croydon University Hospital, London Road, Croydon (Tel: 8401 3494) or Purley Hospital, Brighton Road, Purley (Tel: 8401 3240).

Blood Tests

These are done at the request of the doctor and taken by courier to Croydon University Hospital Alternatively, the Croydon Walk-In Centre provides a service between 0715 – 0815 Monday to Friday. You must take a form from the doctor with you.
